The consequences of Russia-Ukraine conflict across Africa

We will need to re-examine our existing strategic partnerships to better prepare ourselves for the challenges of the future, particularly on energy, food resources and sovereignty and on economic development.

The conflict between Russia and Ukraine has the potential to re-define relations between the West and the rest of the world, in particular with the African continent. In fact, we have begun to see permutations of these developments taking place across the globe.

From the first days of Russia's invasion of Ukraine, the European Union strongly condemned President Putin's decision and imposed the strongest economic sanctions against Russia.

However, African countries appear more divided. A few months on, far from the theatre of conflict, Africa is in the hot seat: the longer the war stretches on, the more severe the economic impact, which will have lasting consequences among some of our countries. The risk of conflicts breaking out is real.

Recently, the visit of the President of the African Union, H.E. Mr. Azlai ASSOUMI, President of the Union of Comoros, accompanied by a large delegation, to the two leaders provided the African continent an opportunity to manifest its desire for a peaceful resolution of the conflict. This is particularly important as Africa bears the

brunt of the economic fallout from the conflict vis-a-vis the costs of cereals and legumes and their transport.

How will Africa make its voice heard on matters of sovereignty, if it does not take a firm and unanimous position regarding the invasion of Ukraine?

Can the neutrality of some States or a position of non-alignment of others lead to further marginalisation of Africa in international affairs?

From where we stand, the emerging multipolar world is an opportunity for Africa

We will need to re-examine our existing strategic partnerships to better prepare ourselves for the challenges of the future, particularly on energy, food resources and sovereignty and on economic development.

The same will be true for every new partner who will knock on the door of Africa.

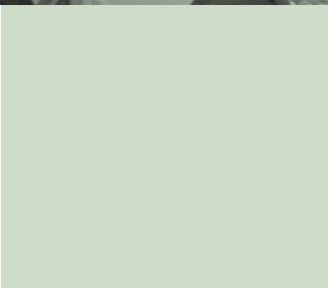

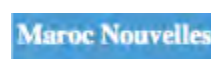
